NOUNT THE BULKHEAD ANGLE

To ensure the weatherstrip sticks, make sure the surface temperature of the bulkhead is at least 50°F and will remain so for at least a day.

If your Frontier came with the factory Utili-track,

remove it using a T40 Torx bit.

Attach the **bulkhead angle** to

the bulkhead using a drill, a 3/8" nut driver, and the

self-drilling screws so that:

a. it's centered side to side. b. it's flush with the top of the

side bed rails, and

c. its longer leg is vertical.

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Use the holes in the truck body left by the self-drilling screws as pilot holes to drill larger, 3/8" holes.

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Hammer a rivet nut into each hole.

Insert the **installation-tool** mandrel into a rivet nut. Hand-tighten it until its hexagonal sleeve is tight to the face of the rivet nut.



Use a 9/16" wrench to hold the installation-tool sleeve as you tighten the mandrel with a 7/16" socket until the rivet nut deforms and locks against the interior of the bed wall.



You'll know the rivet nut is fully compressed when you feel the mandrel become very difficult to turn.





Remove the installation tool by unscrewing the mandrel.



Installing the bulkhead angle is easiest if you pre-drill it using the screws.

Since the top of the bulkhead sits lower than the tops of

the bed rails, the bulkhead angle will end up slightly

higher than the top of the bulkhead itself.


FFIX THE WEATHERSTRIP



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Repeat steps 6-8 for each hole and rivet nut.

Re-install the bulkhead angle by inserting a hex 10 bolt through a plain washer, through each hole in the angle, and into each rivet nut. Tighten with a 7/16" socket.



Do not overtighten the bolts or you might strip


Clean the tops of the bulkhead and angle thoroughly with a clean, lint-free cloth and rubbing alcohol or glass cleaner. Allow to fully dry.





Set the weatherstrip onto the bulkhead and bulkhead angle so that:

- a, it's centered side-to-side and
- b. its narrower band of adhesive lines up with the outside edge of the bulkhead.





Aligning the adhesive band with the outside edge of bulkhead will entail that the weatherstrip overhangs the bulkhead slightly.



Peel the red backing off both adhesive bands 4-6 inches at a time and affix the weatherstrip by pressing down firmly along its length across the entire width of the bulkhead and bulkhead angle.

After you have installed your cover, leave it closed and locked for 24 hours to allow the adhesive, which is pressure-activated, to cure.
